

SITUATION REPORT

Incident: Winter Weather Update March 27-28, 2023 Published: March 27; 4:30 p.m.

KEY ISSUES/CONCERNS AND UPDATES

Weather: A Winter Storm Warning is in effect from 8:00 a.m. Tuesday (03/28) to 5:00 a.m. Wednesday (03/29). Heavy snow is expected, with total accumulations of 2-4 feet along the Sierra crest, and 1-2 feet in Mammoth Lakes, June Lakes, and across higher passes of Highway 395. Elsewhere, total accumulations of 3-8 inches are likely. Winds could gust as high as 55 mph in wind prone locations along Highway 395, and above 80 mph along Sierra ridges.

There may be a brief break in the snowfall Wednesday (03/29) morning. However, snow showers are expected to develop late in the morning through the afternoo. Residents and visitors are asked to prepare for travel impacts to persist.

Twice-Daily Escorts Through U.S. 395 Avalanche Area: Caltrans is escorting vehicles on U.S. 395 between SR 167 and Lee Vining during the following hours (as conditions allow): 7:00 a.m. - 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. This escort may be impacted by the incoming weather system – residents and visitors are urged to prepare accordingly.

Recovery Activity: Progress is being made on snow and debris removal priorities with heavy equipment and dump trucks. Crews continue to repair erosion on roadways to limit future damage. Resource response times continue to be delayed due to road conditions. Crews are actively removing snow and debris from critical infrastructure. Significant structural damage is continuing to occur. Structural engineers and Urban Search & Rescue team assessments are ongoing. Damaged infrastructure and private property are being shored and stabilized.

Winter Storm Damage Survey (Mono County): The Mono County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has developed a survey to collect information from property owners and businesses who have experienced damage to their property/properties as a result of the recent series of storms. The data collected will be used to estimate total damages countywide and determine if enough damage occurred to qualify the region for disaster assistance. Completing the form does not guarantee the region or the property owner will be eligible to receive disaster assistance.
